PARKING & BUS:

In high season, all visitors must use the Vemork bus from Rjukan station to/from Vemork/Heavy Water Cellar. This applies from 18.06-14.08. Private cars can only be parked in Rjukan town centre. Parking is free of charge and the bus ticket is included in the entrance fee. Buy your ticket in advance to make sure you don't miss out. The time on the ticket is the departure time of the bus from Rjukan station.

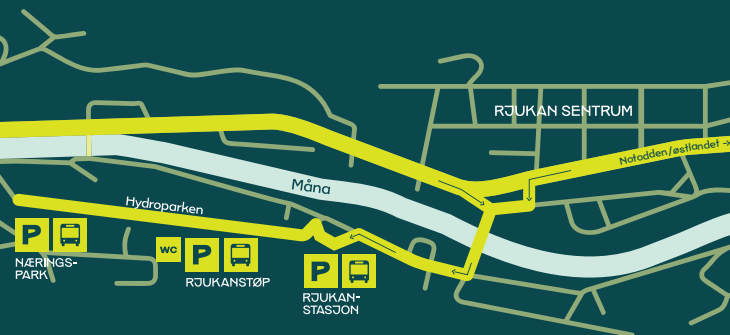

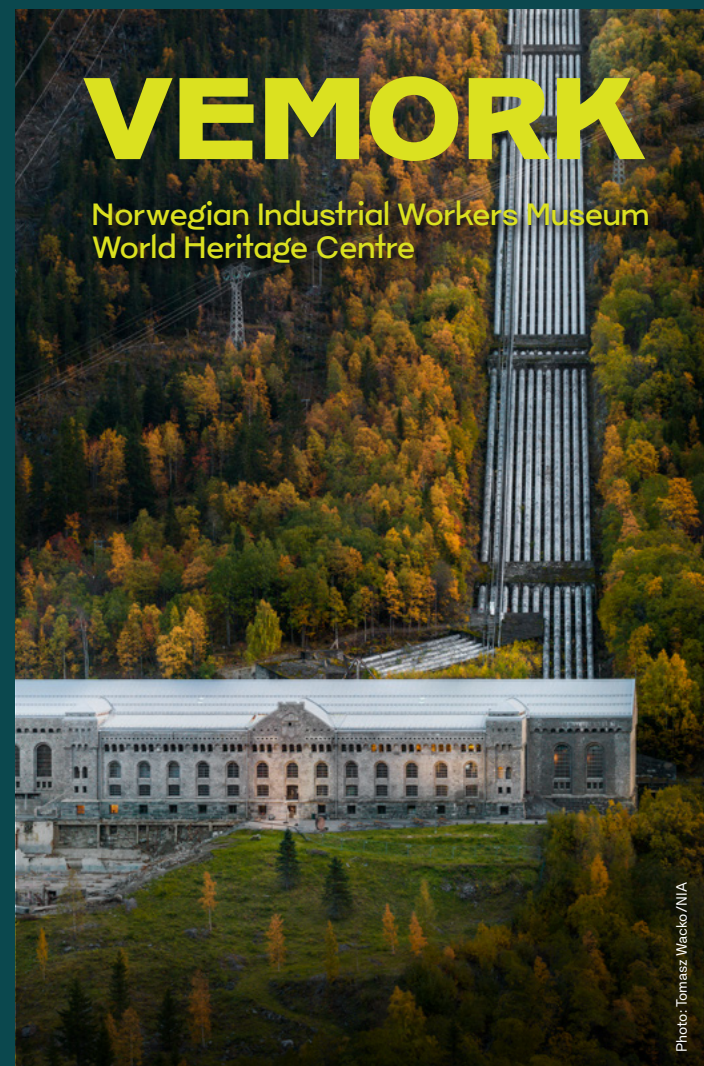

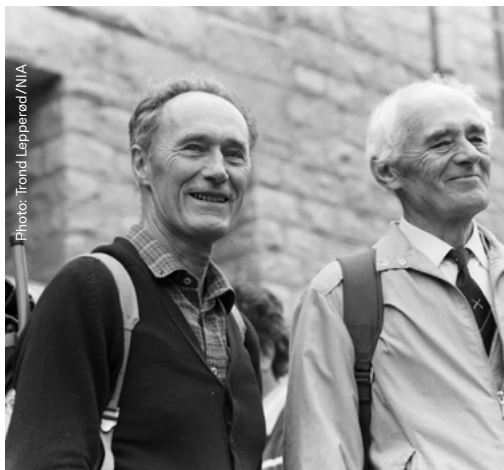
